KEY INSIGHTS

The Hillsboro cluster has the highest-performing zoned schools, with every middle and elementary school exceeding the state average.

JT Moore and West End are the only zoned middle schools in MNPS to meet or exceed the statewide achievement average, and Hillsboro High is the highest performing zoned high school in Nashville with the second highest graduation rate.

Still, 26% of the students are chronically absent, enrollment drops by half between elementary and middle, and only one third of the graduates are ready for college and career.
