DATA SUMMARY

All but one school in the Whites Creek cluster are Priority schools, meaning almost every student in this cluster will attend a low-performing school for every year of their education. Joelton Elementary School stands out as the only non-Priority school in the cluster, with student achievement scores outpacing the state average.

Whites Creek High School is one of the lowest-performing in MNPS, with an average ACT score of 15.4, achievement scores hovering near 5%, and a chronic absentee rate of 42%. Almost one-third of its students are suspended at least once each year. Teacher retention is also a problem at only 47.6%.

KEY

- Reward School Identified by the state as improving student achievement and growth. The top distinction a school can earn in TN.
- Priority School Identified by the state and fall in the bottom five percent statewide over the past three years, and in need of the most support and improvement.
- % Ready Graduate** The state of Tennessee identifies a Ready Graduate as a student who graduated on time and earned a composite ACT score of a 21 or higher, the score at which students are considered career and college ready.
- Chronic Absenteeism** Students missing at least 10% of school days (18 days).
- English & Math: < 35% > 37%** % for English and Math represent the number of students scoring "on track" or "mastered". Schools that fell below the TN state average (35% for English and 37% for Math) are in red and those exceeding the state average are in green.
- N/A** Data not available. When the percentage of students is below 5%, or above 95%, the state suppresses the data because it could be identifiable for students. We can understand that the percentage of students "on track or mastered" is below 5 percent and therefore unavailable.
- ASD** The state-run Achievement School District was created to provide support and interventions at Tennessee's lowest performing schools statewide.
