

the Maplewood cluster in the number of Priority schools with four. With four of the lowest performing elementary and middle schools in the district, hundreds of students in this cluster will attend elementary and middle schools that are ranked in the state's bottom five percent.

In addition, Hunters Lane High School ranks near the bottom for every metric. Although the high school graduates 83% of its students, only 17% meet the state's Ready Graduate standard. Almost one-third of Hunters Lane high school students are chronically absent.
